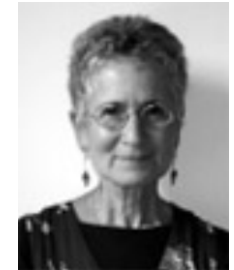
Why You Should Attend

As practitioners in the field of aging and long-term care, we are often confronted with thorny ethical dilemmas.

- What do we do when the needs and/or goals of our employer conflict with needs of those we serve on our own ethical values?
- How can we balance a person's need for autonomy with our concerns for their safety?
- How do we reconcile the goals of our clients and patients with the agendas and goals of family members and caregivers?

These are just a few of the typical conflicts that professionals and practitioners encounter in their work with older adults.

Conference Speaker



Martha B. Holstein, PhD, is a nationally respected ethicist who has worked in the field of aging for over thirty years and has been conducting training in and teaching on ethics for more than twenty years.

Dr. Holstein conducts research on ethics, policy, and community-based long-term care in affiliation with the Health and Medicine Policy Research Group and the Center for Impact Research. She teaches bioethics and ethics for human service providers and consults on ethics with several different organizations, including the Office of the Inspector General, DCFS. She currently is on the Board of the Health and Medicine Policy Research Group, Aging and Disability Advocates, the Chicago Coalition for End-of-Life Care, and the National Academy of Certified Care Managers. Formerly, Dr. Holstein was a Senior Associate for Research at the Park Ridge Center for the Study of Health, Faith, and Ethics (1996–2002).

Conference Speaker (continued)

Dr. Holstein has conducted training, taught and written about ethics for more than 20 years. She is currently teaching "Health Care Ethics" and "Ethics and Aging" at Loyola University, Chicago, and "Professional Ethics" at Northwestern University and at the Spertus Institute for – Jewish Studies. She also lectures on ethics and aging for a variety of audiences and is now working on a basic book on that topic.
